Research

Initiated Swedish research on sign language in 1971. Since 1972 affiliated to the Department of Linguistics, Stockholm University. Research on the structure of Swedish Sign Language includes studies of sign formation, creation of a transcription system for Swedish Sign Language, studies in morphology, syntax, negation, reference, narrative structure, and analysis and evaluation of the manual system Signed Swedish. Present research interests are cognitive sign language theory and children's early sign language acquisition.

Educational development

I have contributed to the creation of Swedish Sign Language as an academic subject at Stockholm University, and to the establishing of the Sign Language Section within the Department of Linguistics. I have developed university programs in sign language for deaf students from basic level up to graduate studies (supervisor of four finished dissertations: Lars Wallin 1994, Johanna Mesch 1998, Marianna Hatzopoulou 2008, Anna-Lena Nilsson 2010), programs for interpreters, and programs in sign language for hearing students at basic level. I have taught courses on sign language since 1979.
