

Iván Zoltán Dénes is a historian of ideas, professor, tutor, independent scholar, initiator of research into historical traumas, trauma management and regimes of memory at the Academia Europaea. He focuses on liberalism, conservatism, nationalism, national identity, historiography, political languages, private history and collective memory, personal and collective traumas, political hysterics and their healings. He authored 12 books, including 7 monographs, and edited 45 others. He has served as a research fellow at the Institute of Philosophy, Hungarian Academy of Sciences, 1977-1997; distinguished scholar at the Department of Political Science at University of Debrecen, Faculty of Arts, 1997-2000; Professor, Chair at the Department of Political Theory and History at the Faculty of Law of the University of Debrecen, 2001-2011; founder and chairman of the István Bibó Center for Advanced Studies of Humanities and Social Sciences in Budapest (1996-2012); editor-in-chief of the *Library of History of Ideas* (vols. 1-19) and *István Bibó's Works. Centennial Edition* (vols. 1-12). He is a member of the Academia Europaea, London since 1995.
